### Fr. Lance’s Letter

“Way” is mentioned twice in this Sunday’s Gospel. The Blind person was sitting by the “roadside”, not on the “way”. But, once able to see, following Jesus on the “way” was the only option left, the only choice in life. The first Christians were called “followers of Jesus”; their movement was called “The Way”.

This weekend we are individually called to leave our seats on the “roadside” and come to Jesus. He is always calling us (or asking others to invite us). By His healing he allows us to see that the ultimate purpose in life is to be with Him, to walk alongside Him, to be on “the way”.

There are two important features we need to recognize. First, we are often seated comfortably on the “roadside”. Our participation in life is focused on doing things for ourselves and making time and effort to satisfy our personal wants and needs. Secondly, we need to realize that we need to “see”, to perceive what we really desire in life: not just things, events, passing pleasures, short-term achievements. What we really desire is the “fullness of life”, “life

in abundance”. This fullness and this abundance our Gospel says come from “following Him on the way”. Following is another word for discipleship. Our deepest desire will be fulfilled in our relationship with Jesus, our “intimacy” (*into-me-see*) with God as we look forward to “seeing Him face to face”.

As this weekend directs us into the new month of November starting off with All Saints Day and All Souls Day, may the special, close, intimate relationship of these saints, these holy men and women become our deepest desire that puts us “on the way with Jesus”.

May God bless us all, keep us healthy and safe during this changing weather, and keep us faithful on our journey to Him - *Fr. Lance*

### ***Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time***

#### ***Mark 10:46-52***

The Gospel of Mark records words spoken by a blind man who sought and obtained Christ's help. He was a common man, one who used simple and direct words which we ourselves should use in our prayers and petitions to God. He called out: "Jesus, have pity on me." That is all he, and we, have to do - call out for God's help. Christ was right there for this man, as He is for each of us. Christ's response to the man was all he, and we, need to hear. Christ told him " [g]o your way, your faith has saved you." He got up and was cured and continued to follow Christ. By this we are shown that when it comes to asking God for help, we don't have to make it complicated or too difficult. We simply have to ask for the help we need and, Mark tells us, we shall receive it.

This week, on November 1<sup>st</sup>, we also celebrate the feast of All Saints. The Communion of Saints is a powerful support concept for us. The Communion of Saints includes all those who have lived with God in their lives in the past, now, and in the future. We are all connected by our faith. Saints have much to teach us, much to share. There is no time in heaven, no time limit to challenge us. Just think about the effect that time has on our lives and our constantly chasing the clock. We never seem to have time to do the important things in life. We never seem to be on the right side of time - we are either too old or too young, too busy or too bored. Think what a difference no time in heaven will have on our existence. We can know and learn from the example of all who have come before us, by those who live now, and by all those who will live after us. Heaven without time gives us a great blessing. May all those who have existed with us in faith in Christ help us learn to love and help each other without the limits of time. Let us be open to all those great saints, big and small, who can help us live our lives today, devoted to You.

#### ***EVANGELIZATION CORNER***



**Invitational Evangelization** (a.k.a. Event Evangelism) is similar to the Interpersonal or Direct approach, but as its name suggests, it begins with inviting people to events like a church service, a retreat, or a Bible study. This is one of the most natural ways to reach out to others when you may not have the right words to say.

There are many events offered both at St. Virgil's Parish and within the Paterson Diocese to which you can invite someone to learn about Jesus.

Our recent Candlelight Rosary Walk celebrating the 101<sup>st</sup> anniversary of the miracle at Fatima would have been an excellent event to invite someone to. You might consider inviting someone to St. Paul Inside the Walls which is hosting an interactive, small-group experience aimed at bringing each participant to a new understanding of Jesus and His Church. Or you may want to invite your neighbor to our Men's Cornerstone weekend retreat – "God's Plan for You" – at the Loyola in February where participants can reflect, renew and strengthen their faith. In March you can invite someone to St. Virgil's where Alan Hunt from Dynamic Catholic will speak about "Finding Your Greatness" and introduce attendees to four simple ways to reach their full potential.

When we hear the term Event Evangelization or Invitational Evangelization we may think of a one-time or a particular moment in time— one conversation or a single event — where we can sow a seed or reap a harvest. But, reaching out to friends, family and co-workers with the gospel can be more than a single event and more of a process. Whether evangelism is a 'sowing' process, or a reaping event is not so much determined by our intention, but by the response of the one we invited.

Evangelism may not be just a moment but a series of moments or events in a person's life that have a cumulative effect of bringing them to faith in Jesus Christ. It can be a process that is often the result of a series of conversations, a confluence of circumstances or a number of events. It is actually about cooperating with the Holy Spirit in someone's journey toward Jesus. It may mean joining together with them on a journey with God.

Paul gives us an example of the process of evangelism (*Acts 18:4*). In Corinth Paul reasoned with the Jews in the synagogue every Sabbath, with mixed results. Although Crispus, the leader of the synagogue, believed many of the Jews 'resisted and blasphemed.' But Paul kept coming back to explain, clarify and reason with them. In Thessalonica we read where Paul followed much the same pattern (*Acts 17:1-9*). Over a period of three Saturdays he reasoned with them, explained and gave evidence that Christ was the Messiah. It would seem that in both cases Paul's progressive building of a case for Jesus as the Messiah could be described as a process.

For some, Paul's first synagogue message was an evangelistic **event**; an experience of reaping the fruit born by God's Spirit. They believed the first time they heard the gospel. For others it was the first step in a **process** that took weeks or even months and years.

May His grace be with each of us as we continue on our journey with Jesus.
